

Terms and conditions of the Royal Burgh of Wick Community Council

SSE micro grant funding

- Grants given to any organisation or group must benefit individuals within the area covered by the Royal Burgh of Wick Community Council
- Micro grants will not be awarded:
 - For commercial projects or projects which will receive income from sales
 - For political or religious purposes
 - To replace statutory funding
 - For purposes adverse to SSE's interests
 - To support individuals for their personal gain (other than skills development)
 - For activities that do not comply with current legislation or good practice guidelines
- Copies of invoices or receipts paid for from the micro grant must be sent to the Royal Burgh of Wick Community Council
- The annual round of micro grant funding begins in June each year. Individuals and organisations who receive a micro grant are free to make subsequent applications during each annual round, although demand from others at that time will be taken into consideration.
- Applications for a project can only be made to a single community council; if funds required are in excess of £250 an application to the full Caithness Beatrice Community Fund can be made.
- Applications will be reviewed monthly and considered quarterly by the Community Council. Criteria used when considering applications will include the number of people to benefit; if the overall costs are achievable; the long term benefits; sustainability; and the wider community benefit
- Successful applicants must agree to publicity photographs
